Bayside Drive upgrade

During winter 2017 construction of a new sea wall at Bayside Drive at the Walkerville Hall and boat ramp has been completed. This will help to protect the coastal assets for another 50 years.



The remaining civil works including new road pavement and footpath, car and trailer parking, roundabouts and landscaping will be undertaken by South Gippsland Shire Council. This is due to commence at the end of January 2018. The Committee is also contributing to these works. The proposed works will ensure easier launching and retrieval of boats, reduce conflict between road users and deliver safer boating practice.

Landslip at Walkerville South

The Committee has sought professional advice from an engineer and Parks Victoria regarding the landslip on the track between 2nd and 3rd beach at Walkerville South. It is considered that the intervention required to rectify the track would be too intrusive upon the fragile environment and the land will continue to be unstable and at risk of future landslips.

The track will be closed for the foreseeable future and is impassable in that section. Please obey the warning signs and do not enter the area as the land is unstable. The Committee is undertaking other existing track maintenance and upgrades to continue to allow access to the same Walkerville South beaches.

Fires

- Open fires are strictly prohibited during summer.
- The foreshore and surrounding bush is extremely dry.
- Be alert for smoke and fires and call 000 and Paul or Sarah on 5663 2224 if you see anything that looks like smoke or fire.

Water

- The water supply for the camping area is drawn from a local creek.
- Water restrictions are in place this summer.
- No showers or washing machines are to be used between 10 am and 4pm. During this time toilet blocks will be cleaned so please avoid use while being cleaned.
- No hosing down of boats permitted.
- Please be very frugal with water.
- Water should be boiled for drinking.

Vehicles

- It is illegal to drive along the beach between North and South Walkerville.
- On hot days parking is very busy at Walkerville South. If possible, park at Walkerville North and walk, or park at the top of the hill at Walkerville South and take the track to the beach.
- In Walkerville South, no vehicles are permitted south of the boat ramp.
- Parking attendants will be working at South during January.
- Boomgate at park: one code per car is issued upon payment, max 2 cars per site. No tailgating through the gate. Extra cars need to park in carpark at entrance.

Noise

- No noise after 10 pm. After a second warning campers will be asked to vacate their site.
- Please be aware of others and keep noise down at the rotunda.

Dogs

- Dogs are not permitted in the camping reserve at any time.
- Dogs are not permitted on the beach between 9 am and 6 pm from December 1 to March 31.
- Dogs are permitted on leads on the beach before 9 am and after 6 pm from December 1 to March 31.
- Dogs are permitted on lead other times (except in the camping reserve).

Rubbish

- The Walkerville Foreshore is a delicate environment, please minimise the rubbish you leave at the reserve.
- Please do not put plastic bags in recycling bins and continue to be diligent about recycling bottles and cans.
