## Seawall augmentation

During spring 2019 the construction of a new sea wall at the Walkerville Foreshore Camping Reserve took place. The seawall will protect the shoreline from erosion including protection of vegetation, infrastructure and the camping reserve camp sites.



The seawall was augmented in two sections, at the northern and southern most ends of the camping reserve. The design of the seawall was prepared by industry experts water, coastal and environmental consultancy Water Technology Pty Ltd.

## Walkerville North Streetscape

During 2019 the streetscape project at Walkerville North was completed. The area between the boat launching facility and the toilet block along Bayside Road were revegetated with native species. The installation of a bbq is also being investigated.



## **Camping Ground News**

Many exciting projects have been undertaken in the camping reserve during 2019 with more planned for 2020 such as a camp kitchen within the park.

## **Community Planting Day**



It was great to have the community come together for our Revegetation and Community Planting Day in early October. Ausnet have also undertaken some pruning of trees within the reserve for safety and fire reasons.



#### Rotunda Refurbishment



The rotunda near the playground has recently been repainted and additional cooking facilities will shortly be installed including a fridge and hotplates.

## Enjoying your holiday at Walkerville

#### **Fires**

- Open fires are strictly prohibited during summer.
- Be alert for smoke and fires and call 000 and Paul or Sarah on 0487 007 176 if you see anything that looks like smoke or fire.

#### Water

- The water supply for the camping area is drawn from a local creek.
- Water restrictions are in place this summer.
- No showers or washing machines are to be used between 11 am and 3pm. During this time toilet blocks will be cleaned so please avoid use while being cleaned.
- No hosing down of boats permitted.
- Please be very frugal with water.
- Water should be boiled for drinking.

#### **Vehicles**

- It is illegal to drive along the beach between North and South Walkerville.
- On hot days parking is very busy at Walkerville South. If possible, park at Walkerville North and walk, or park at the top of the hill at Walkerville South and take the track to the beach.
- At Walkerville South, for safety reasons no vehicles permitted on the beach between 25<sup>th</sup> December to the end of the Australia Day weekend.
- Parking attendants will be working at South during January.
- Boomgate at park: one code per car is issued upon payment, max 2 cars per site. No tailgating through the gate. Extra cars need to park in carpark at entrance.
- No drones in the park without consent by WFRCoM.

#### Noise

- No noise after 10 pm. After a second warning campers will be asked to vacate their site.
- Please be aware of others and keep noise down at the rotunda.

#### Dogs

- Dogs are not permitted in the camping reserve at any time.
- Dogs are not permitted on the beach between 9 am and 6 pm from December 1 to end of Easter.
- Dogs are permitted on leads on the beach before 9 am and after 6 pm from December 1 to end of Faster
- Dogs are permitted on lead other times (except in the camping reserve).

#### Rubbish

- The Walkerville Foreshore is a delicate environment, please minimise the rubbish you leave at the reserve.
- Please do not put plastic bags in recycling bins and continue to be diligent about recycling bottles and cans.
